Billy Then a biblical question, which applies to the legendary history of Moses, respectively about the flight of the ancient Hebrews, whereby the alleged god Jehovah through the west should have lead, and I mean in the day through a column of smoke and in the night through a column of fire, which was proceeding in front of them. About this already your father told me, that this god-signs-story is a lie, because in truth the whole thing, the flight with the columns of smoke and fire did not take place in the Sinai with a Mount Sinai respectively Moses mountain, because Moses and the refugees had gotten lost and drifted southwards and followed the smoke- and fire expelling of a volcano in the region of the present Saudi Arabia.

- 48. That's correct, because the columns of smoke and fire were the results of a volcanic eruption, that expelled clouds of smoke and fire, which however was not in the Sinai, but much farther into the south in present Saudi Arabia.
